Industry Keynote Address
Jerry Moyes

Monday's Opening "Industry Keynote Address" will feature Jerry Moyes, Chairman, President and CEO of Swift, the holding company for Swift Transportation Co., Inc., a truckload carrier headquartered in Phoenix, Arizona. The Swift subsidiary operates the largest fleet of truckload carrier equipment in the United States with regional operations throughout the continental United States. Mr. Moyes joined Swift in 1966 as a Vice President and served in that capacity through 1984, when he was then named to the company's leadership position.

Mr. Moyes was President of the Arizona Motor Transport Association from 1987 to 1988. He is currently on the Board of Directors of American Trucking Associations as Vice President At-Large. Mr. Moyes is a graduate of Weber State College with a degree in Business Administration.



Closing General Session
Gene Kranz

Closing General Session speaker Gene Kranz was the lead flight director at NASA Mission Control tasked with bringing the Apollo 13 spaceship and its crew back to Earth safely in 1970 after its oxygen system failed. Kranz's struggle to devise this plan was chronicled in the hit film, Apollo 13, which starred Tom Hanks and Ed Harris, who portrayed Kranz in the movie. The motto that carried him through the Apollo 13 crisis, "FAILURE IS NOT AN OPTION," is a major theme of Kranz's uplifting and motivational message.

ISSUES FORUMS:

In 2003, NITL, IANA and TIA expanded the Sunday morning Industry Issues Forums to address emerging challenges and current topics confronting the Highway, Rail, and Ocean industries as well as a security forum dedicated exclusively to current and emerging security related rules and regulations.

Building on these well-attended and successful forums, this year's activities will again focus on topics of relevancy to carriers, third parties, shippers and vendors alike and will advance discussions from the various perspectives affected. Issues will be addressed from legislative, regulatory, policy, commercial and operating points of view.

EDUCATIONAL SEMINARS:

Follow the Freight Flow

As trade and transportation volumes grow, infrastructure is increasingly short supply. However, changes in logistics' practices have caused some economic obsolescence in some transportation network components. This session will explore trends and emerging freight flow patterns such as:

- All-water routing thru the Panama Canal and possible expansion of the Canal.
- Short sea shipping lanes.
- Inventory deferment and Southern California transloading.
- Southern California as the nation's import cargo mixing center.

The Future of Transportation Equipment

As business continues to grow, the relationship of equipment to service will be significant. This session will address issues such as: the increasing predominance of 53ft. equipment in intermodal service, uses for the legacy intermodal car fleet, terminal handling of private equipment, and carrier assumption of the chassis obligation. The discussion will also focus on equipment ownership issues and the responsibilities for future equipment development.

Risk Management in a 3PL-Shipper Environment

This session will explore the cargo liability issue from a legal, as well as, a market perspective. The discussion will address the responsibilities of shippers/carriers/3PL, managing the claims process, and other insurance issues.

Trade-Driven Transportation Requirements

Transportation demand is greatly derived from global trade. As globalization continues, transportation providers may be required to provide services in markets that do not have sufficient infrastructure or suitable political and financial institutions. The impact may be that current transportation networks and practices may no longer be sufficient. Multilateral and bilateral trade agreements will only add to the complexity of requirements needing fulfillment. This session will examine what transportation demands might be in the future, the current state of those systems, and a "gap analysis" of possible shortfalls.

Transportation Policy Nexus

Transportation policy in the U.S. has always been hampered by a disaggregated, silo approach, along geographic and modal lines. Reauthorization of TEA-21 is a major component in determining the future of freight policy initiatives. But without recognition of other influencing factors, such as: homeland security, energy policy, and environmental concerns, we are only touching the "tip of the iceberg." This town hall meeting will be a "call to arms" to address these potentially conflicting policy areas.

Multimodal Optimization and Best Practices

In this time of tight truck capacity, third party providers afford access to hundreds of smaller carriers and mode neutral transportation options. This session will look at how 3PLs add capacity, optimize mode selection, provide carrier management, liability management, and tracking/tracing. Also included in the discussion will be: carrier selection methodology, insurance management, and highlights of best practices for all involved.

Contracting Issues

This session will look at contracting between shippers, carriers of all modes, and 3PLs for protection, service, and increased options. The discussion will cover best practices and the importance of setting benchmarks in contracts. It will also address the evolution of contracts.

Focus on Domestic Security

This session will emphasize the impact of security regulations on the movement of domestic freight including hazardous materials and general freight. The discussion will review current and pending regulations and the agencies involved in the development and enforcement of these regulations; the role of shippers, carriers, and 3PLs in working with the Department of Homeland Security and other regulators; and the relationship between the security requirements on domestic and international shipments.

OSRA at Five

The passage of the Ocean Shipping Reform Act was a major accomplishment for the NITL and shippers in general. Five years after implementation, what has been the impact? Areas of discussion will include:

- The influence of discussion agreements compared to conferences.
- The impact of unbundling of charges on service.
- The impact of the Ocean Transportation Intermediaries (OTI) petitions to the FMC for confidential contracting.
- The impact of mass retailers taking overseas control of import cargo.

Customer Relationship Management - Aligning for Maximum Customer Satisfaction

This session will look at managing customers, SPIN selling for increased sales, checks and balances and reporting requirements across the shipper, 3PL, carrier, and receiver network.

Strategic Transportation Sourcing

This session will deal with methods to procure transportation services in a sane, rational manner. Issues to be covered include the difficulties and challenges surrounding reverse auctions and finding an optimal blend of service and pricing.

Accessorial Charges-The Battleground Between Cost and Price

Accessorial charges have always been a contentious area between customer and carrier. The steady rise of fuel costs and new hours of service regulations have made this subject even more germane in today's markets. Some transportation modes have seen providers trying to unbundle various cost components, while shippers are demanding "all-in" comprehensive rates. Often, these transactions require extensive manual processing and reconciliation to resolve disputes and payment. This session will review the practice of accessorial assessment from the perspective of carriers and transaction parties.
