NITL Applauds the Class I Railroads, Unions, and the Biden Administration For Averting a Rail Strike

Washington, DC, September 15, 2022. NITL respects that the agreement reached is tentative and calls upon the affected unions' respective memberships to ratify soon providing more certainty for NITL members and its customers."
