Session Topics

Integrated Communications in Multi-Modal Supply Chains: Enhancing Connectivity Across Rail, Ocean, and Highway Networks

Effective communication is the lifeline that keeps supply chains running smoothly. And, as the utilization of multi-modal transportation options grows, the role of integrated communications plays a crucial role in optimizing the flow of goods and information across rail, ocean and highway networks. Each speaker provided insights in their respective modes and positions in sharing how to best ensure the communication flow between modes. The moderator did an excellent job of not only keeping the session moving but engaging the audience in the discussion.



Session Topics

<u>Navigating Geopolitical Turbulence: Understanding the Impact of Rising Tensions on</u> <u>Global Supply Chains</u>

There is no denying that we exist in a global economy. Escalating geopolitical tensions in the world present significant challenges and disruptions to global supply chains. The speakers on this panel offered valuable insights and practical strategies for navigating these geopolitical tensions and safeguarding global supply chains. The importance of

building resilience and agility in this ever-changing landscape cannot be understated. Moderated by Mark Szakonyi from JOC, the panel led us through how they have positioned their companies to mitigate supply chain disruptions.



<u>Securing the Digital Frontier:</u> <u>Navigating the Landscape of Cybersecurity</u>

In an era defined by digital transformation and interconnectedness and AI, cybersecurity has become a critical concern for businesses, governments, and individuals alike. Businesses are scrambling to secure their networks and looking for direction. This "fireside chat" featured two experts in this field. They not only offered valuable insights and practical guidance for navigating these threats, but they also took the time to explain the issues so the audience could understand the problem and how best to protect their networks.

<u>AI-Powered Transformation: Revolutionizing Shipper Operations for Efficiency and Agility</u>

There is no doubt that AI has arrived, and this session spoke to how shippers are harnessing the power of artificial intelligence (AI) to optimize shippers' operations and drive innovation in the logistics industry. We are still learning about the transformative impact of AI on shipper operations. This panel touched on demand forecasting and route optimization as well as inventory management and customer service.

Sustainability in the Supply Chain: Nurturing Ethical Practices for a Greener Future



In this session, the panel shared real world examples of companies that have successfully implemented sustainable practices within their supply chains. They discussed the relationship between sustainability and supply chain management and how businesses can integrate ethical practices into their operations.



Session Topics

Streamlining the RFP Process: Collaborative Solutions for Carriers and Shippers

This session is a follow-up and result of last year's Engage conference. During the 2023 Carrier CEO panel there was a lively discussion surrounding the RFP process and how it could be improved. As a result, NITL put together a collaborative team of shippers, carriers and brokers (the first integrated team since the development of the VICS bill of lading in the early 90's). Working together over the last few months, the team put together a white paper outlining issues and recommending best practices for RFP events. The panel presented highlights of their findings and also provided the ability to access the paper on the <u>NITL website</u>. As a follow-up project, the team is looking at developing suggested contract templates that will be available to NITL members. The project is being viewed as a living document to be reviewed and revised as needed.



<u>Unforeseen Disruptions: Understanding How Natural Disasters Impact Global Supply</u> <u>Chains Beyond Affected Areas</u>

This topic could not have been timelier. With hurricane season coming earlier and hitting Florida, North Carolina, and Tennessee during our meeting, proving to be particularly devastating, and supply chains still recovering from the pandemic have been strained. Natural disasters have far reaching consequences that extend beyond the immediate areas of impact, causing ripple effects throughout global supply chains. The speakers talked about the interconnected nature of supply chains and the cascading effects of natural disasters. They shared strategies for enhancing resilience and mitigating risks across the entire supply chain network. It is more important than ever for supply chain professionals to prepare for these events by having a written strategy and conducting business disaster and recovery drills to help mitigate these disruptions.

<u>Navigating Nuclear Verdicts: Understanding Trends, Causes, and Future Outlook Across</u> <u>Ocean, Rail, and Highway Transport.</u>

In recent years, the transportation industry has faced a rising tide of "nuclear verdicts" massive legal judgments that have significant financial and reputational impacts on companies involved in accidents. The speakers in this session were very engaging and informative as they looked at trends, root causes, and the future of nuclear verdicts with each transportation sector. They also offered recommendations to enhance safety procedures and mitigate risks to protect your organization's reputation. The speakers made what could have been a dry session into a very engaging and informative one.
