A graduate of Rutgers University-Camden with a degree in Marketing, Kevin further expanded his industry expertise by earning his Certified Transportation Broker (CTB) certification from the Transportation Intermediaries Association (TIA). Through this program, he gained a deeper understanding of third-party logistics (3PL), regulatory requirements, and the legal framework that shapes the freight brokerage industry.
